  - b. Meet the Proficiency through course work, see VTSU Policy here,
- 4. Pass EDU TEW1\*\* (0 credits) in any semester. Enroll concurrently with EDU-2060 Perspectives on Learning or the earliest semester thereafter upon declaring the pathway.
- 5. Pass EDU TEW2\*\*\* (0 credits) in the semester prior to transfer.
